On December 8, a special feast for the **United States** and Canada, we celebrate the feast of the **Immaculate Conception**. This feast centers on the belief that Jesus' mother, the Virgin Mary, was **conceived** without sin. It is **special** for us because:

In 1792 Bishop John Carroll, **consecrated our nation to Mary** under the title of the **Immaculate Conception**.

In 1846, the U.S. bishops unanimously **rededicated** the United States to the **Immaculate Conception** as **patroness of the nation**,



On May 1, 2020, during the coronavirus pandemic, Archbishop Gregory, (now Cardinal Gregory) rededicated our country to Mary's protection under the title of the Immaculate Conception. In renewing the consecration during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Archbishop invoked the Blessed Mother under her various titles:

"Mary, Health of the Sick ... we entrust to you all who are infected with the **coronavirus.** 

"Mary, Mother of Consolation ... we entrust to you all those who have **lost l**oved ones in the pandemic.

"Mary, Help of Christians ... we entrust to your loving protection all caregivers.

"Mary, Queen and Mother of Mercy ... we entrust to you all who are **suffering** in any way from the **pandemic**.

"Mary, Seat of Wisdom ... we entrust to you all who are working to find a **cure** to this pandemic.

"Mary, Mother of Good Counsel ... we entrust to you all **leaders** and **policymakers**. Let us add our "Amen" to these prayers as we continue to pray for all who have Covid19, caregivers, unemployed, and those suffering in any way from this virus.
